

Spain: Andalusia's horticultural exports make almost 2,000 million Euro

According to data provided by the Council of Agriculture, Fisheries and Rural Development of the Government of Andalusia, the region's horticultural product exports from 1 September 2013 to 30 June 2014 have totalled 2,050.85 million kilos (including melon and watermelon), with a value of 1902.67 million Euro. Tomatoes have been the most exported product, reaching 608.19 million kilos with a value of 623.90 million Euro.

The second most important crop were peppers, with 445.01 million kilos and 517.41 million Euro, followed by cucumbers, which have reached 447.77 million of kilos with a total value of 359.69 million Euro.

In fourth place we find courgettes, with 230.70 million kilos and 175.91 million Euro, followed by aubergines with 97.93 million kilos and 92.92 million Euro; watermelons, with 151.63 million kilos and 74.44 million Euro; melons, with 56.52 million kilos and 37.49 million Euro and lastly green beans, of which 13.10 million kilos have been exported reaching a value of 20.93 million Euro.
