

Vigo received more fresh fish in November

In last November, 20,179 tonnes of fresh fish were landed in Spain, 13 per cent more than in the same month in 2013 (17,843 tonnes), reported [Puertos del Estado](#).

According to a report by the entity under the [Ministry of Development](#), between January and November 2014, Spanish ports received 215,640 tonnes of fresh fish. This volume represents an increase of 0.9 per cent over the same period in 2013, when 213,525 tonnes were discharged.

The port of Vigo concentrated the largest landings last November, receiving 7,990 tonnes, 15.7 per cent more than during the same month in 2013 (6,901 tonnes).

Meanwhile, in the first 11 months of last year 68,931 tonnes were landed in this important Galician port, 1.1 per cent less than in the same period of 2013 (69,709 tonnes).

A Corunna port ranked second, with 53,465 tonnes entered between January and November 2014, a 24.9 per cent increase over the same period in 2013 (42,776 tonnes). Behind stood Pasajes port, with 20,557 tonnes.

The port of Algeciras Bay was the one that registered the largest increase in landings, 113.4 per cent. It had received only 537 tonnes in the first 11 months of 2013, and 1,146 tonnes in the same period of 2014.

Further back stood the ports of Valencia with 2,376 tonnes, 32.6 per cent more than in January-November 2013 (1,791 tonnes); and Tarragona, with 4,742 tonnes, 31.8 per cent more than in the same period in 2013 (3,597 tonnes).

The largest decrease was verified in the port of Ceuta: It only received 3 tonnes of fresh fish in the first 11 months of last year, 94.3 per cent less than in the same period of 2013, when landings totalled 53 tonnes.

Another port where there was a significant decrease in fresh fish downloads was that of Alicante: 85 tonnes were landed, compared to 281 tonnes between January and November 2013, that is to say, 69.7 per cent less.

In the port of Motril, the fall in fresh fish landings was 61.9 per cent as this terminal received 880 tonnes, while in the same period last year 2,311 tonnes had been unloaded.
