



Fishing landing reached 812.8 thousand tons in November

In November, the volume of national fishing landings amounted to 812.8 thousand MT, meaning the second highest result of the sector in the last 12 months and an advance of 2.6%, compared to the same month of 2019, as reported by the Office of Evaluation of Impact and Economic Studies of the Ministry of Production (Produce).

The result was based on the increase in landings of hydrobiological resources for Direct Human Consumption (+ 14.2%) and, to a lesser extent, the performance of the extractive activity of anchovy destined for Indirect Human Consumption (+ 1.2%).

The head of Produce, José Luis Chicoma, highlighted the November result because it allowed the consolidation of six months of continuous growth in the sector and a favorable contribution to the national GDP.

He explained that the landing of resources for Direct Human Consumption was driven by the capture of mackerel (+ 508.7%), horse mackerel (+ 109.2%), scallop shell (+ 81.0%) and squid (+ 47.8%); which had an impact on the performance of the frozen products (+ 34.7%) and curing (+ 25.8%).

Greater catch of anchovy

The Minister of Production also highlighted the 710.1 thousand MT of landings of resources destined for Indirect Human Consumption (+ 1.2%), with important emphasis on the extraction of the anchovy resource, enabled through the second fishing season 2020 in the North zone -Centre of the country, started on November 12.



The largest anchovy landings were recorded in the ports of Malabrigo (226 thousand MT), Chimbote (103 thousand MT), Pisco (64 thousand MT), Tambo de Mora (59 thousand MT) and Coishco (57 thousand MT), which they concentrate 72.0% of the catch.

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
